# February 2022

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What is the purpose of the church? Why does the church exist? How can Holy Lamb fulfill the answers to these questions?

Our Sunday morning Bible study has been addressing these questions for the last several weeks. Interest in this topic has more than doubled the size of the group to 15, as we explore the biblical examples from the ministries of Jesus and the first century church.

Consider the following 'activities' that Jesus, the disciples, and the church undertook: (This is only a sampling)

#### Jesus:

Changed water into wine (John 2:1-11) Fed 4000 and 5000 people on different occasions (Matthew 15:32-38; Luke 9:10-17) Healed the sick (Matthew 14:1-4; Luke 5:12-13) Healed the disabled (Matthew 13:10-13; Luke 5:17-26) Restored sight to the blind (Matthew 18:35-43) Cast out demons (Luke 8:26-33) Raised the dead (Matthew 9:18-26; Luke 7:11-17; John 11:1-46)

#### The disciples and the first century church:

Healed the sick (Acts 5:12-16) Cast out demons (Luke 10:17) Fed the widows (Acts 6:1-6) Shared their possessions with those in need (Acts 2:44-45; 4:34); Healed the disabled (Acts 3:7; 9:32-35) Raised the dead (Acts 6:39-42; 20:7-10)

Of course, the most important 'activity' was preaching the Gospel of forgiveness and salvation through Jesus Christ.

As you consider the variety of preaching and miracles that were done by, and in the name of Jesus, can you find a single, simple phrase that describes their work? How about, "They met the needs of people at the point and level of their need."? From wine, to healing, to hearing the Gospel, Jesus and the church addressed the needs of individuals they encountered. Jesus did not start a winery because he liked making wine. The disciples didn't feed the widows because they liked to cook. Paul didn't preach because he was an excellent public speaker (as a matter of fact, he was not an imposing presence). In each and every case, including the proclamation of the Gospel, the actions of Jesus and the church were an intentional response to a very real, demonstrated need.

This may seem elementary, but it seems that in developing programs and ministries, we often lose sight of the specific need we think we are addressing. Instead, we boldly and actively engage in activities which make us feel good, but often miss the intended mark.

Let's take a new look at how to plan ministry by assessing an actual, voiced need, not merely a perception or assumption. Let's discover the actual spiritual, physical, emotional, financial, and other needs of our members and community and then develop a ministry to address one or more of those needs, keeping the specific need in focus so we don't get distracted with our own perceptions and desires.

Initially, these conversations would not include whatever building or financial implications may be associated with the program. Those topics would be addressed in full after we decide on the ministries to be undertaken. That is, the type of building additions or modifications needed would be determined by the ministries we plan to initiate. Likewise, funding would be driven by the needs of the particular ministries. Building and finances, along with our individual talents, abilities, and time, are the means to facilitate the need-meeting programs we choose.

As we consider how best to use the vast resources at our disposal, may God guide our thoughts and conversation in order that we, as Jesus and the early church did, meet the needs of people at the point and level of their need, as we proclaim the Gospel by word and deed.

Holy Lamb in Ministry

#### **Sunday Morning Bible Study**

We are exploring ministry options for Holy Lamb, just as the Apostles, in Acts 6, needed to make determinations on how to meet the needs of that church community. While our needs are different, so are our resources. Determining which ministry activities we will undertake is a spiritual and theological decision as much as a financial and administrative one. #### **Tuesday Morning Bible Study**

We are studying the book of Revelation, the last book of the Bible. This study is often requested and attracts a large attendance because Revelation *can* be so difficult to understand. Many false teachings and misguided understanding arise when individual passages are taken out of context. We have some excellent resources that look at Revelation as one unit. This brings everything into alignment, making the book far easier to understand. Our first question revolves around, "How can the Christian respond to terrible things that happen?" This can apply to specific events in one's life (diagnosis, death, or any other devastating occurrence), or to the uncertainty and anxiety caused by world affairs. It also raises the question, "Where is God when all of this is happening?" Please join us to learn some answers, or to raise your own questions.

The week of January 31, we will finish our 5 week study of the Gospel of John. We have been blessed by this slower more thoughtful reading of this gospel—a chapter or less per day. 
