Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

God continues to bless Holy Lamb with new and abundant resources for fulfilling his mission. For several years we have been receiving new members who come to us with experience in both administrative and ministry matters in prior churches. At our December voters meeting, we learned that God continues to bless us with financial resources beyond what is necessary to 'keep the lights on and the staff paid.' At that time we talked about developing a path forward to explore additional ministry opportunities as we seek to discern God's will for Holy Lamb as stewards of the blessings he is showering on us. (See Matthew 25:13-30)

This process began over a month ago in our Sunday morning Bible class. We began by looking at the work of the first century Christian church in Jerusalem as they dealt with some shortcomings in meeting the needs of its members. (Acts 6:1-7) We also considered Jesus' instruction to come to the aid of those in need as though we were ministering to Jesus, himself. (Matthew 25:31-46).

Using these passages as the premise for our discussion, we began to identify various needs in our community and among our members. This conversation was expanded to include all of the congregation on January

26. In that Sunday's sermon, I described how Jesus met the needs of all the individuals he encountered, and explained that, after His ascension to heaven, the church has the responsibility to continue His ministry of meeting the spiritual, emotional, and material needs as God has enabled us. I encouraged all members to add to the list that was distributed in the bulletin, in order that we would have as broad a spectrum of identified needs as possible. We followed that with discussions on what kind of ministries Holy Lamb might use to address those needs. Finally, we identified resources already on hand, as well as additional ones that might be needed, in order to develop such ministries. Our initial list of identified needs numbered over 30. In each subsequent step, the needs and ministries selected for further discussion were identified by members of the Bible class, not a few select congregation leaders, nor myself.

We have reached the point that we need to begin the administrative task of creating action plans to implement these ideas. For that process, our president, Ron Hadjuk, and I will assemble a committee to create a skeleton action plan suitable for each ministry that has reached this point in the process. This committee will then bring these proposals to Council for action. Council will determine which ministries to pursue. Each ministry selected by Council will then have its own team to develop a complete plan for making these ministry ideas a reality.

This is an exciting time to be a part of the life and ministry of Holy Lamb. I have never been in a congregation that has made such an intentional effort to identify various needs of congregation and community and then, just as intentionally, seek to discern God's will in determining how to meet those needs.


Women's Bible Study

And whether or not you meet with us, this can be another easy way to develop a daily Bible reading habit. On Monday, February 28, we begin our Lenten study of Ezekiel.
