FEELING DISCOURAGED

Repeatedly the Children of Israel disregarded the words of the Lord God and the instructions handed down to them through his servant, Moses. "Repeatedly" might be an understatement. While they often gave Moses and God lips service, they clearly had no intention of following the Law to the extent God wanted, they didn't understand how important the terms of the covenant were.

As we read through the Pentateuch (the five books attributed to Moses), we find Moses dealing with discouragement—often dealing with it in unhealthy ways. When we become discouraged we get frustrated and angry.

Recall Moses descending from Sinai, the tablets of God's law in his arms. Hearing the commotion below, and seeing the golden calf and the people's behavior, Moses smashes the tablets given him by God. (Exodus 32)

In Exodus 17 God provides water from a rock. In this instance Moses is to walk toward a rock that is part of Horeb, God's mountain. He is to take his staff and rap on the rock which then gushed forth water.

Failing to remember that God always provides for the needs of his people, they later complain to Moses again; Numbers 20.

Angry that he must go through this a second time, Moses listens to the words of God half-heartedly. Maybe he figured, he's heard it before. So taking his staff in hand Moses strikes the rock. But this time God has command Moses to speak to it. Still, the rock produces its water, but failure to heed God's instruction means that Moses will not enter the Promised Land.

Frustration leading to anger gets us nowhere.

We are now a year into our pastoral vacancy. But we are far more than a year into our lives as Christians, and as a Christian congregation. Little has changed in that regard: we are God's baptized sons and daughters. We still have our personal ministries; we still are enjoined by scripture to pray and intercede for people and situations. Situations—flooding, global warming and climate change, war, terrorism, hunger and homelessness, and the need for more pastors. Take your pick; what issue has God placed on your heart?

Because of God's undeserved kindness and mercy Bible studies continue, Sunday services of Word and Sacrament continue, keeping us alive in Christ Jesus. At Holy Lamb we seem to enjoy each other's company and fellowship opportunities. Visitors come. Truly, we are not bad off. Disappointed in not having a full-time pastor can lead us to frustration and to trouble. And to be honest, what candidate for pastor wants to move to a congregation that is frustrated, sitting on the sidelines and doing nothing positive? They want to see Christ at work in us and through us in the community.

The answer; together we need to be diligent in prayer. We need to be praying that God will raise up pastoral candidates for our synod as well as Holy Lamb. They won't come from out of the blue; they must come from among us, our sons and grandchildren. At some point people began pointing to me (Pr. Steve) and encouraging me to become a pastor. Look what God did—he chooses the most unlikely people.

Just skimming through the letters of Paul, notice how often he speaks about the ministry of encouragement. This is work for you. Use your concordance in the back of your Bible; ESV has a short list. Google can be a help. Encouraging one another is a sign of the Holy Spirit in our midst.

A parting word: "Encourage one another day after day, as long as it is still called "Today," so that none of you will be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin." Hebrews 3:13

2024 Hurricane Preparedness

We are in the hurricane season. There are steps we can take to protect ourselves and our possessions.

- * First and foremost, it is important to monitor local weather reports and follow advisories from local authorities about preparation and evacuation.
- * Know your zone.

Zone A

All areas east of Business 17 up to the intersection with US 17

Zone B

All areas east of US 17 bypass to US 17

All areas south of Hwy 707 and Longwood Drive

All areas in Longwood Plantation (Blackmoor sub division)

Zone C

All areas between Hwy 701 and Hwy 544

All areas east of Hwy 31 to Hwy 90

All areas east of Hwy 90 to US 17 in northern Horry County line

- Develop a family disaster plan.
- Prepare an Emergency Supply Kit. Make sure to stock or restock not perishable food items and replace batteries.
- Put copies of important documents in a safe place, preferably a water tight container.
- If you have prescription drugs, make sure to document the RX number, name, address and phone number of the pharmacy where you fill your prescriptions. Also record your administering doctor's name and phone number.
- * Create an evacuation plan. Know your evacuation route and decide early when you will leave and where you will go.
- * Identify an out-of-area emergency contact.
- * Fill up the gas tank in case you have to evacuate.
- * Have enough cash on hand for a few days because ATM's may not be available due to power outages.

Holy Lamb maintains an **Emergency Contact Sheet** for each of our families. An elder will be contacting you to update your information or complete a new sheet.


